

Assemblywoman Nily Rozic '00 was elected to the 25th Assembly District in November 2012, representing neighborhoods in northeast Queens, including Flushing, Queensboro Hill, Hillcrest, Fresh Meadows, Oakland Gardens, Bayside and Douglaston.

... At 26 years old, Rozic became the youngest woman serving in the New York State Legislature. Her experience in government started long before that as an aide on more than a dozen campaigns at the local, state and national level before becoming Chief of Staff for Assemblymember Brian Kavanagh. She has been an outspoken advocate for working families, immigrant communities, and young women. In the State Assembly, Rozic sponsored and passed legislation aimed at revitalizing New York's environment, expanding government transparency, and strengthening workforce development programs.

Assemblywoman Rozic was born in Jerusalem and raised in Queens, where her dedication to public service to create meaningful change began at an early age. Prior to her election, she was active in her community, serving on Community Board 8, as a member of Hillcrest Jewish Center and a board member of the Townsend Harris HS Alumni Association.

At graduation last year, Assemblywoman Rozic presented the Dugma Lemofet Award to a deserving SSSQ 8th grade student. The alumni presenter and student recipient of this award exemplify our schools' goal of preparing our students to become successful, compassionate, contributing members of our society.
